- witness in action and word to the Gospel of Jesus and the love of God
- respect and support the Catholic identity and mission of the school as part of the Catholic Church.





Culture

We contribute to our culture when we

- create a learning environment that is engaging, relevant, creative and responsive to the needs of children and young people
- create a caring, protective and safe environment that promotes the wellbeing of all in the community
- act professionally, with moral standards and integrity
- demonstrate collegiality through open communication, shared decision-making and confidentiality
- promote the spiritual, physical, social, moral and intellectual wellbeing of all children and young people in our school
- encourage children and young people to understand and appreciate diversity in culture and beliefs
- are a good influence in the lives of children and young people to inspire them to work for the common good, in particular sustaining and improving natural and social environments.

Partnerships

We build partnerships in our community when we

- respect and value the role of families as integral members of our Catholic school communities and as partners in the education of their children
- are conscious of the community within which we work, our role in strengthening the Catholic identity of our school and its connection to the local Church
- work cooperatively with our community to foster learning and to nurture the spiritual, social and moral development of children and young people
- recognise that a privileged relationship with children and young people exists and understand and honour that professional relationship.

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
