#### Snapshot of the Catholic Church in South Australia

South Australia is home to 275,849 Catholics, just under 20 per cent of the total state population, according to the 2021 Census.
 The Archdiocese of Adelaide covers the city of Adelaide and outer metropolitan areas as well as the regional areas of Yorke and Fleurieu Peninsulas, Riverland, Barossa Valley, Adelaide Hills, Kangaroo Island, Coorong, South East and Limestone Coast. There are 87 schools, 57 parishes with 128 Mass centres, 21 migrant communities and four eparchies (Eastern Rite).
 The Diocese of Port Pirie covers most of SA and the southern part of Northern Territory, including Uluru, totalling 980,000sq km, with 14 schools and 14 parishes with 46 churches.



# CLEAR WAY TO PERSONAL SUCCESS

CATHOLIC EDUCATION SOUTH AUSTRALIA'S HOLISTIC EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM GIVES STUDENTS THE RIGHT TOOLS TO THRIVE



tudents from Catholic schools across South Australia achieved outstanding SACE results in 2022. More than 3000 students obtained their SACE, recording a 99.9 per cent completion rate. Thirtyfive per cent of grades were in the A band, with 346 merit certificates awarded to 281 students and 10 students receiving the Governor of South Australia Commendation - Excellence Award for their outstanding SACE results.

While this excellence in education is to be lauded, for Catholic Education South Australia (CESA) executive director Dr Neil McGoran the success extends beyond academic results. "It's about the development of the whole person - you as a learner, as a thinker, as a creative person, and as a person of faith who is heart-filled and compassionate.

"Good subjects and good curricula should do all of those things at once so, while you're learning, you're thinking ethically and morally about what you might be able to offer your community in the future."

Part of this focus is a commitment to regularly identifying and monitoring the learning needs of each individual child. To this end, CESA embodies Clarity, a Professional Learning Suite based on

collaborative education created by world-renowned researcher Lyn Sharratt which places 14 parameters at the heart of education.

"The first parameter is, every student can learn," Dr McGoran says. "It sounds simple but it is your starting point in a Catholic education - how you see a young person as someone who is made in the image of God and can learn, develop, grow and thrive. If you see a young person in that way, you can teach that young person."

Another parameter focuses on supporting students failing to progress with their learning. "If you put a teaching program in place but realise it's not having an impact, then collectively we work with each teacher and each student to work out how we might change that," Dr McGoran says. "That can take you to different teaching styles but also can include additional support being provided, such as allied health, that is necessary sometimes to help young people feel well about themselves in order to learn most effectively."

Using a data wall can help educators monitor the progress of each individual student and pinpoint potential issues as soon as they arise. "I like to see it as how we operate most of the time in families. We have our own children and you can see if they're on

track, but you can sense sometimes when they're not. The sooner you see it, the sooner you can have a conversation about what might be happening and what we need to do to make this different.

"The way we operate in families is so beautiful, so connected to people and it's so much out of love. If you take it in a school setting and apply it to every student, ultimately, the beneficiaries are the young people." Investing in those doing the teaching is also a key priority. "When you look at high-performing schools, you notice some patterns," Dr McGoran says. "They almost always have a principal who is a clear, instructional leader, who understands learning, understands the curriculum and can drive and negotiate with teachers and bring out the best in them.

"Then you have teachers who fundamentally believe in young people and are committed to their own professional development as educators in Catholic schools. They understand the role of Catholic education as an expression of the church's mission. And you have schools that have strong connections with other schools because they realise to learn from each other generates improvement. All of those things come together in a way that makes a difference to young people."

# SMALL SCHOOL WITH BIG POTENTIAL

Located in the heart of Clare, St Joseph's School is leading the way in excellence in education, with students consistently getting strong NAPLAN results above the national average



t Joseph's School in Clare is the small school that's making a big impact. The Reception to Year 9 co-educational school – with less than 350 students – consistently delivers exceptional NAPLAN results, not only above the state average but above other schools with similar cohorts as well.

In 2020, St Joseph's recorded averages well above all other Australian students in every test, with an outstanding 99.7 per cent of tests meeting national benchmarks. "We have a culture where it's cool to be successful," principal Peter Shearer says. "One of our core values is continuous improvement. We invest time and energy into seeing each child as an individual and supporting them to achieve their potential."

That potential stretches outside the classroom, with a wellbeing program

and targeted intervention part of the daily curriculum.

"We use data to inform change and the data is really strong that if children aren't well in their own being they don't achieve as well," Mr Shearer says. "We have students doing their best in a whole range of avenues. One student has just been selected in the state under-12 girls' football team, while recently another young lady was the opening batsperson for the state under-12 cricket team, and yet another made the state under-16

softball team and represented Australia in New Zealand. Last year we had six students who represented the state in either football, squash, softball and girls' cricket teams.

"It's about our students developing their talents to be the best version of themselves, which in turn makes them feel great about themselves which results in better learning outcomes."

And staff investment in students' outcomes extends beyond the classroom. Recent interest in mountain biking has led to coordinated rides after school and at the weekends so the young cycling enthusiasts can hone and develop their skills. "We entered a Year 5-6 team in mixed mountain biking for the first time and they came second, while our boys in the Year 8-9 division came third," Mr Shearer says.

The school has also invested in six human powered vehicles so that students in Years 7 to 9 can learn the art of Pedal Prix. "The children go out to the local aerodrome during their lunch in school time and then they gather after school on Wednesday night to go for a ride. It's meeting the students' passions and assisting them."

Extra-curricular accomplishments are also celebrated. "Three days a week we have line-up where children sing happy birthday to each other," Mr Shearer says. "We proudly publicise any achievements over the weekend so it's acknowledging successes and acknowledging students working hard, whether that is being involved with scouts, whether it be dance, literacy or poetry competitions.

"We try to run a small school ethos where children are empowered to do the best they can in anything."

or Saint Ignatius' College principal Barbara Watkins, last year's exceptional SACE and ATAR results reflect more than academic excellence – they also reflect human excellence.

The college is celebrating outstanding results for its Class of 2022, with all Year 12 students gaining their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE). Across the board, students gained 128A+ grades, including 55 Merits, 234 A grades and 184 A- grades. The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) scores were equally impressive, with an average of 86.7 and a median score of 90.0.

"We are very proud of the whole cohort. Coming out of the pandemic, all schools in the state were probably concerned about how students would perform – and our students really performed so well," Ms Watkins says. WORDS LYNN CAMERON PHOTOGRAPHY RUSSELL MILLARD

"I am really proud that our students received Merits across a large number of SACE courses, not just in one area. We talk to them from their first days at the college about curiosity and intellectual pursuits, so even from a young age they are well-versed at collaborating on problem-based learning. They can apply those key skills no matter which subject they are studying, whether that is English, Chemistry or any other subject."

But it's about more than getting good grades. As a Jesuit school, the college embraces holistic education, where academic learning blends with social, emotional, physical and spiritual aspects. "A great tradition we have here is we talk about human excellence, which is in every part of ourselves. For everyone that is slightly different. Our teachers work with students in a collaborative and thoughtful way. Students have mentor teachers whom they meet with every day and who look after them holistically."

That collaboration extends to the students themselves, who take pride in not just their personal success but the success of the college as a whole. "It's altruistic in its approach," Ms Watkins says. "Our students care about each other. It's not just 'I have to get my best results'. It's more 'I am going for my personal best myself but I'm doing it for everybody as well." It's also about outfitting students for life after graduation.

"Most of our students will go to university and we want them to be able to manage that because it's very different from school life. That's why we focus on building a person of human excellence who will succeed in all the different jobs or careers they are going to have. We don't know what those careers will be so their kitbag of skills has to be diverse and strong and they have to be happy to apply themselves."

Giving their best in everything they do appears to come naturally to Saint Ignatius' College students. "They roll up their sleeves and they get going with it, no matter whether it's academics, sport or music," Ms Watkins says. "They really apply themselves incredibly well, which means one day they will be a great worker and a lifelong learner."

# **COLLABORATION ACROSS THE BOARD**

Students at two schools are working together to design and build new equipment to develop their skateboarding skills

xcitement is ramping up at St Augustine's Parish School (SAPS) as a new skateboarding space begins to take shape. Young enthusiasts at the Salisbury R-6 school are collaborating with Year 11 and 12 students at Thomas More College (TMC) to design and build ramps to extend their current equipment and help develop their skateboarding skills. The cross-school collaboration was inspired after SAPS Year 5 teacher Dave Cottrell shared his passion for skateboarding with upper primary students from the school. It quickly became a hit and the school's inaugural Skate Club was formed in 2022. Every week, up to 20 students in two ability groups come together to learn new tricks and techniques.

"One of the highlights has been having several of the advanced riders be able to 'drop in' to the quarter pipe," Mr Cottrell says. "Watching them overcome their fears and experience unbridled joy is amazing."

Last year, the students visited Virginia Grove Skatepark where they could fully test out all they had learned. Now the school is investing in more infrastructure. "The visit to Virginia Grove showed we needed more equipment here to extend students' skills," principal Dan Cowan says. "Knowing part of the Years 11 and 12 curriculum at TMC is to design and build things, I could see a good way of connecting with them."

SAPS students created video clips and sent them to TMC, where design tech teacher Billy Blauhoefer-Clogg has since been supervising the design and construction of two ramps. "So far, our Year 11 student Austin has begun construction of one of the skate ramps," he says. "Tom in Year 12 has come up with some designs and we have finalised which design he will create. We're aiming to get Skate Club to come to TMC and check out some of the production process."

For Skate Club members, the opportunities to test their limits both on and off the skate park has sparked their own emotional growth. "We have seen one girl's confidence grow and develop and she's one of our student leaders this year," Mr Cowan says. "We're not saying it's just because of Skate Club but something changes within you when you try something difficult and scary and you overcome it. That permeates everything else that you do."

# PICTURE OF TOGETHERNESS

A school mural depicts the beating heart of one of the state's most multicultural schools



f a picture paints a thousand words, crafted on a wall at St Brigid's School Kilburn is a mural that speaks volumes. The mural – depicting black and white hands holding, surrounded by flags from many nations – is a powerful symbol of one of the state's most multicultural schools. Thirty-five cultural backgrounds are represented among the 130 students, with almost 80 per cent speaking a language other than English at home.

The mural was designed by Year 6 student Ali Al Shinawa as part of the South Australian Living Artists festival in August 2022 and was brought to life on the school's wall by local artist Iman Elmawey. "We're proud that this artwork was created by a student in our school community. What he has drawn shows a connection of how he feels he fits into our school – that sense of belonging," principal Shannon Correll says.

That sense of belonging is at the heart of St Brigid's School Kilburn, a place not just of education but of welcoming, where both the academic and wellbeing needs of each individual child are catered for.

Ms Correll is leading the way with learning – she has embraced Dr Lyn Sharratt's "Clarity" work and has been hailed as the gold standard for Catholic Education South Australia.

Part of this work involves a data wall which helps keep track of every student's progress in reading, writing and specialised intervention programs. "Our staff work really hard at ensuring we consistently triangulate data to ensure all students are achieving," Ms Correll says.

Clarity, a Professional Learning Suite, emphasises the collaborative process of education. "We worked through learning modules to really individualise our students in getting to know every child in the school – it's called knowing the faces of our children," Ms Correll says.

"Every staff member took on the responsibility of supporting our students in their learning. Through that, we've been able to see excellence in growth in learning outcomes."

Students' personal and wellbeing outcomes are also a priority. A full-

time chaplain and wellbeing coordinator support their personal and social welfare, while a quiet corner offers a safe space for students with learning needs.

The school is also invested in positive outcomes for families. A community hub supports learning English, citizenship classes and playgroup.

"Research tells us that when parents are engaged in their child's education, there are better learning outcomes for their children" Ms Correll says.

"We're an old school – the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart – and our school pillars are based around being a heart. The hearts of children – that's our connection."

# **NORTHERN SOUL**

#### Investment in Catholic schools in Adelaide's northern suburbs is supporting the growth of new communities

here's something unique about Xavier College in Adelaide's northern suburbs. You feel it across all campuses: Evanston, Two Wells and Gawler Belt – that sense of belonging, of community.

It's the reason the Reception to Year 9 campus at Two Wells – which only opened its doors in 2021 – has gone from strength to strength, with more than 600 students currently enrolled.

"The growth of the college has been extraordinary and is something we're really proud of," head of campus Janet Coomber says. "We anticipated we would grow but not to this level and so quickly. "There are a few reasons for this: because of the Xavier reputation in the area, because we have worked hard to create our own community here and because it feels like a family.

"The old adage of it takes a village to raise a child – it is like that here. Teachers come to us looking for work. They all say they can feel the strong culture – it's something tangible."

Pastoral care is a key priority at Xavier College, with designated oratory teachers looking after students throughout their educational journey, providing an additional layer of friendship, support and guidance that gives them the opportunity to be known and loved for

who they are. "The pastoral care element of

Xavier is what makes us really unique," Ms Coomber says.

The college also embraces the Rite

Journey, an educational program for Year 9 students designed to empower them to be responsible adults who display courage, commitment, consideration, compassion, collaboration and connection.

Students engage in a number of activities through this program including a Mount Lofty climb and a "Departure and Calling" ceremony held at sunrise at the beach in which students and their family participate together. The program culminates with an overnight experience.

"The Rite Journey sits well with our Salesian ethos and values, allowing students to learn how to grow and be as responsible as they can in the manner they want," Ms Coomber says.

"They start to understand their own ethics and values and use these capabilities to become the best version of themselves as they navigate adolescence and grow into adulthood."

The amalgamation of St Brigid's Catholic School in Evanston becoming a third campus of Xavier College at the beginning of 2023 reflects Catholic Education South Australia's commitment to expanding education options in the north.

Xavier College will soon incorporate two R-12 campuses across three sites. An ongoing expansion at the Two Wells campus is currently underway which will eventually take the campus from Reception to Year 12.

"While our facilities are going to be extraordinary, our people are amazing," Ms Coomber says. "Our teachers and support staff are incredible – there's not one member of staff you wouldn't want caring for your child."

# Bonnie the mini groodle is building confidence and helping students make new connections



t Joseph's Tranmere's newest member of staff may not be able to read or write but she is proving extremely pup-ular. Bonnie, a 10-month-old mini Groodle, is the school's wellbeing

dog, tasked with supporting students experiencing anxiety to overcome their fears and engage with classmates and students. It's a task she takes seriously.

"Bonnie and I are outside at the gate in the mornings to greet the children as they come into school," says Tanya Barrett, Bonnie's owner and the school's director of teaching and learning. "We visit classes during the day and work with individual children who need that extra support. She's a really good talking point for children who don't have the social skills to join in a game or have a conversation.

She walks around our welcome circle and lets us pat her. It makes me feel happy ... I feel lucky to have Bonnie at school ... It makes me happy to have Bonnie here and I talk about her with my friends "Children with anxiety will seek Bonnie and me out. Previously it could be a struggle to get them into the classroom, but now if you tell them they can have 10 minutes with Bonnie and she will walk them back to their classroom, they tend to go back to their class quite willingly."

For principal Adrian Grbin, having Bonnie on site bolsters the school's renewed focus on student wellbeing to counter the impacts of the recent global pandemic.

"One of the things we're noticing more since Covid is the growing importance of ways to support children who may be anxious coming into the school," he says. "It's very



traumatic for everyone when a child is anxious and has difficulty coming through the gate or going into the classroom. Being a smaller school gives us the ability to get to know each child extremely well and determine what support they might need. With a support dog, we have something to help them."

She's also a hit with staff. Bonnie frequently attends executive meetings and staff meetings and enjoys a wander through the staffroom. "When she comes through the staffroom at recess or lunch time, there's a lot more laughter," Ms Barrett says.

Bonnie's success is due in no small part to the commitment of Ms Barrett, who has invested her own time, research and money into bringing this fluffy bundle of joy into the children's worlds, with the school funding her training. Both puppy and owner are learning their skills through Dogs Connect, an organisation that introduces wellbeing dogs into schools.

"It's all about safety for Bonnie and the children – it goes both ways," she says. "It's a lot of work but I'm learning how to do that best with Bonnie and training the children at the same time."

Year 2 students Ava, Tilly and Oscar are thrilled to have Bonnie on board. "She walks around our welcome circle and lets us pat her. It makes me feel happy," Oscar says. It's a feeling shared by his classmates. "I feel lucky to have Bonnie at school," Tilly says while, for Ava, "It makes me happy to have Bonnie here and I talk about her with my friends."

It's this kind of feedback that Mr Grbin cherishes. "I like to think the children are proud we have a support dog in our school and it's something they can tell their friends and families about. It's been a wonderful experience for us."

# Students at St Martin's Greenacres take great pride in designing and creating their own mosaic crosses for graduation



raduation is always a special moment but, for students at St Martin's Catholic Primary School in Greenacres, coming together for the final time is the perfect opportunity to take pride in an extra special achievement.

From Year 6, each student has been designing and creating their own unique mosaic cross as a memento of their time at the school. The crosses, which represent creativity, faith and tradition, are presented to the school at their graduation ceremony.

"As a Catholic school, we wanted to do something that was symbolic for our students and allowed them to create a graduation gift that was meaningful to them," principal Christine Comas says.

"For us, seeing the students lined up with their crosses is a wonderful

moment. It's a sense of achievement and you feel like a proud mother because the students are leaving on a high and are taking away something that is personal to them.

"All the students are very careful of how they carry them – they hang them at home where they take great pride of place."

The creative freedom in designing and building their crosses encourages students of all faiths to explore and extend their creative and artistic skills as well as bolstering communication skills.

"They are engaging in the art of conversation," Ms Comas says. "They are talking to each other, they're not on their phones or on the computer – everything has to come from them."

Year 7 Kildare College student Grace-Emily completed her mosaic cross last year. "I was mostly excited but I was also nervous about how it would turn out," she says. "I loved the creative freedom. The colours I used are some of my favourites.

"At the graduation ceremony, everyone walked in with their crosses – it was exciting and I felt proud to be a part of the school's tradition in making my cross."

Brother Hugh is in Year 6 at St Martin's and beginning his own mosaic journey. "I'm not artistic so this is going to be a new challenge but I'm excited about it," he says.

The mosaic crosses are part of a robust visual arts program at the school, which also includes soap carving, pottery and planter boxes in the Sensory Garden. Around the school hang eight mosaic placards, created collaboratively over the years by students, teachers and volunteers, representing the school's eight values of safety, service, respect, honesty, pride, friendship, service and responsibility

"There's always something different happening in the art room," Ms Comas says. "It's good we have our wonderful specialist visual arts teacher, Helen Williams, who loves this kind of work."

major expansion at Western Technical College (WTC) is skilling up today's students for the jobs of the future.

While the majority of Mount Carmel College's graduates move into higher education, the WTC is also a major provider of trade training pathways. These pathways have been boosted by the addition of facilities and courses including electrotechnology, automotive servicing, plumbing, information technology and screen and media, in addition to the existing trades courses of construction, metal engineering, and hair and beauty.

For students interested in a handson career, the WTC - part of the outstanding Mt Carmel College educational hub which also comprises a primary campus at Pennington and a secondary campus at Rosewater - offers Year 10 students a "Try-a-Trade" program, supported by local employers and industry organisations. Year 11 and 12 students have extraordinary opportunities to gain

#### An expansion of training pathways at Western Technical College is preparing students for the jobs of tomorrow

SACE credits and VET qualifications at Certificate II and III levels suited to high-demand jobs in the maritime. shipbuilding and defence sectors.

'But we don't hone in just on those industries," principal John Konopka says. "Part of our work here is to broaden students' understanding of where a trade can lead. It's saying, 'When you learn to work on the circuit boards in washing machines and dryers, you'll be employable in a range of careers. And plumbing isn't just working with toilets those refrigerators with ice water dispensers, the massive ducting for airconditioning in warehouses are all plumbing'."

Training is carried out at the college under the supervision of skilled trainers.

"Often when students go to an RTO they're treated as an adult, which in some ways is good but many students still need the structure of a school," Mr Konopka says. "We check up if they're absent, we know if there's sickness or they're struggling with the work so they get the industry qualifications with the help, support and structures that come with being a school student."

The college is currently running an all-girls' construction course with 15 female students. "We want them to feel comfortable that, if they are

says. "They're doing a fantastic job and are breaking down barriers just by being here."

WTC students Aeisha and Hannah are proud to be bearing the flag for young women in trades in South Australia. "Now I've learned more about trades. it sounds like a cool place to work but it would be nice to expand the number of women," Hannah says.

The 15-year-old is enjoying learning new skills. "It's something new and not what you usually learn in a school environment. I think carpentry sounds pretty fun. It's nice to learn something more hands-on and a possible job for the future."

Fourteen-year-old Aeisha has taken a liking to tiling but is keen to try her hand at other trades.

"It's good to talk to people in the actual industry and RTOs to see what I would like to do in the future," she says. "There is such high demand for skilled workers so I am confident of securing an apprenticeship if I decide that's what I want to do."

# **THE JOY OF KINDNESS**

# Acts of compassion are forging new intergenerational friendships for students at Our Lady of Grace, Glengowrie

oy. It's a small word with a big meaning. And acts of kindness from students at Our Lady of Grace, Glengowrie, are bringing joy to older members of their local community.

In December, the school came together to create Christmas gift boxes for residents of the Charles Young Aged Care facility. The boxes – containing cards and lollies – were delivered by Year 4 students, who also performed Christmas carols for their enthralled audience. "The children love sharing and performing, and the residents were just beautiful," Year 2/3 teacher Carol Sharland says.

That joy has continued since. In February, the Year 2/3 class presented residents with Valentine's Day hearts and, in May, Year 6 students shared their favourite stories. "The children are just so engaged. They said, 'The older people just looked so happy when we were there'," Ms Sharland There is something about that presence that reciprocates the connection, the relationships and wellbeing. The residents say it's something they look forward to. They talk about the children with each other and you just see that excitement about them

says. "It's that sense of fulfilment: everyone wants to go back."

The visits enable students to fulfil the school's values of service and compassion. "We're a small school with a big heart, and that's something we aspire to live up to," principal Josette Charles says.

The regular intergenerational interaction is having a profound effect on both young and old. "There is something about the children's presence that reciprocates the connection and wellbeing," Ms Charles says. "The residents say it's something they look forward to. They talk about the children with each other and you just see that excitement about them. For our students, these are real life skills – it shapes them to reach out and to be welcoming, to engage, to respect that older people deserve to be connected."

Year 5 student Harry helped to deliver the Christmas boxes of joy.

"I was sitting down next to a lady and she grabbed my hand and kissed it," he says. "It was interesting to talk to her."

Year 3 student Mila presented the Valentine's Day cards and likes "seeing the smiles on their faces". And the experience has helped to expand Year 6 student April's compassionate nature. "I'm now speaking to others more nicely," she says. "It feels good to be kind to others and see them smile."



# IN FROM THE COLD

n a cold night in May, students from St Mark's College Port Pirie achieved an incredible feat that will change the lives of homeless people in the local area.

The students volunteered to spend a night sleeping on the hard floors of the school gym or outside veranda, dealing with bright lights, noise and the cold – raising \$21,647 for the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul in the process.

"They wanted to be in solidarity with young people sleeping rough," says Annie Olsen, assistant principal, religious identity and mission. "It was really eye-opening for our students to experience those tough conditions.

"They're not as tough as the reality would be but, compared to their usual night's sleep, it was a big change for them. It really drove the message home."

The money raised will help the local homeless feel safer in their town. "People experiencing homelessness in Port Pirie would like to have one of the barbecue shelters bricked in for a wind break. We're hoping the money we have raised will be directly used in that project," Ms Olsen says.

"It's really good for our students to have something tangible they can see that they have put all this work towards. The money just kept going up and up and that was really exciting for them. To see how it's spent will be fantastic."


